- Work that shows what kind of a learner you are – Conley's Key Learning Skills (goal setting, persistence, self-awareness, motivation, help-seeking, progress monitoring, self-efficacy, time management)
- Work from a variety of subject areas - your teacher will give you more specific information about the number of pieces required.

List each item you decide to include, then explain why you selected that item and what it shows about you as a learner (Conley's Learning Skills). When you're finished, cut the sections apart and attach each section to the appropriate piece in your portfolio.
